From the desk of our Executive Director Anita Bowen



Maybe you know that BCSSI receives funding from a variety of sources including the federal government as a pass-through to us for some of our programs, including transportation, information and assistance, and caregiver programs.

These funds are given to us after the fact ... in other words, after we provide transportation or caregiver support, we send a claim to various entities to get reimbursed. Sometimes, as in the case of the funds we receive for the transportation program (for people of all ages), we are required to match what they are giving us for operations at 50-50. So, if we receive a hundred dollars, we have to raise one hundred dollars ourselves in order to draw down that funding. These grants are called government reimbursement grants.

I decided to share this important information with you because while BCSSI is **NOT** a government organization, we do receive a significant amount of government funding, and we are thankful for this fact. Sometimes, the funding can take time to get to use and, therefore, we are so grateful for individual donors, and local community support from organizations and businesses that sustain us (and can go toward the "match" when required) that comes in on a regular basis. Your

contributions to support items that you enjoy, such as the Senior Sounds newsletter subscription of \$10/year can add up and contribute in a positive way to our budget. We even welcome donations by credit and debit card and those can be set up to support BCSSI on a regular basis.

We really work hard to have strong local relationships and those of you who have lived in Boone County your entire life (or most of it) know how much the community is changing and will continue to do so year after year. We're kind of excited about meeting new people and they seem to walk through our doors each week. If you have a chance to personally invite someone to come to one of our programs/activities this spring, we would be honored and look forward to meeting your guest(s). Those old lyrics come to mind once again... makes new friends but keep the old. One is silver and the other gold. The song goes on to say - a circle's round, it has no end. That's how long I will be your friend. BCSSI has been in the friend business since 1978 and the way we are sustained the most is through those on-going friendships and support.


6 eggs Salt & Pepper 1 Tbsp. olive oil 1 c. chopped asparagus

1 c. cherry tomatoes, halved

1 c. baby spinach

1/4 c. crumbled feta or goat cheese

Preheat oven to 350°. Whisk together eggs and salt and pepper to taste in a large bowl. Add oil to oven safe skillet and heat over medium heat. Add asparagus and cook until softened, about 3 minutes. Add tomatoes and spinach and cook until spinach is wilted, about 2 minutes. Add eggs to skillet and sprinkle with cheese. Cook 2-3 minutes until edges begin to set. Transfer skillet to oven and cook 12-15 minutes until set and golden brown. Garnish with more cheese and fresh herbs if desired.
